

Conway Springs' foot ball team furnished the local foot ball fans with some pleasurable entertainment yesterday afternoon. Home folks like to see a game where the visitors put up a good hard game, and yet the local team wins. That was what occurred yesterday. The game was never a walkaway, and yet Mulvane was never in serious danger, save at the last minute, when Conway was making toward our goal when time was called.

The game started with Mulvane receiving the ball and marching it down the field principally by line plunges, until within striking distance of the Conway goal. Here Conway held for three downs and Gail Rutledge sent a field goal over the posts for the first three points.

Before the first quarter ended the home boys worked the ball again across the field, with good machine work; Paul Rutledge taking the ball over with a run through tackle.

In the second quarter, Epperson right end, caught a forward pass and made 30 yards for a touch down, and Rutledge went through for another before the first half ended, Kinble kicking goal, and the score stood 22 to nothing in favor of Mulvane.

In the second half Conway stiffened perceptibly and held Mulvane until the near the end of the third quarter when Mulvane had the ball on Conways 3 yard line. Pressed by two minutes rest it looked like Mulvane had an easy touch down, but with three yards to go, and two downs to make it in but the third down lacked a few of going over, and on the fourth Kinble took the ball over a couple yards, but because his team mates failed to help him he was pushed back, and the ball went to Conway.

Mulvane, however made another touch down that quarter, Gail Rutledge string through Conway's line for the score.

Three minutes before the end of the game Paul Rutledge, Mulvane's star quarter was put out of the game for getting too suspicious, he and a Conway kid mixing it, and the referee seeing only him. This weakened the teams' defense and Conway made some good gains, and might have scored with more ease.

For Conway, Pete Adair, right half, was easily a star, gaining most of the ground for the visitors. The Mulvane team all played well, the line holding, and the backs going good. Tommy Carroll intercepted a pass for the visitors and made a big gain. Kinble also made a good gain on a pass. Let to Lindsey deserves credit for some clever defensive work, and Tommy Carroll, and the Rutledge boys were great on both offensive and defensive work.

No one was hurt, and but little time was taken out. Clyde Smith acted as referee and John Knightly as umpire.

There was no kick on the official and the Conway boys were a treat.
