MHS Boys Turn It Up A Notch

The Mulvane High School Wildcat boys passed the test Friday night, Jan. 16

With all the commotion of homecoming, with all the hub-bub of Jackie Stiles visiting and under the eye of "Mulvane's greatest team," the Cats came up big

Mulvane shot to the lead early and held on down the stretch to clip Goddard, 50-41.

The Wildcats raised their record to 3-6 as they headed into the Chaparral Roadrunner Classic this week. They drew the No. 5 seed and were to have played No. 4 Arkansas City (3-6) at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 21.

The high school had one of its biggest non-tournament crowds ever Friday night with a number of activities happening but the Cats didn't get caught up on the fanfare of honoring the MHS boys team of 1983-84 that captured the school's first and only Class 4A State championship

The present-day Cats buzzed out to a good start and by halftime, held a 30-14 lead that was threatened, but was never relinquished.

"We played a good half of basketball," admitted Coach Ryan Herrs. "We shot the ball well, we played good defense. I don't know which made me more happy! Our defense was strong the whole game. We came out after the halftime show and they out-scores us, 15-5, to get back in the game but the good news is that we had some guys hit big free throws and that won the game for us."

The Lions, who slipped to 1.8 for the season, sliced the Mulvane lead to four points with about 1.30 left but senior Zach Kimble iced the game with four consecutive free throws to keep the Cats on track.

"I'm disappointed those free throws had to be that important but the main thing is that we hit them to keep the lead," said Herrs. "I'm still waiting to see our team hitting on all cylinders. (Brad) Enochs did a tremendous job on the boards and Gavin Snider just needs to get more touches. I'm just waiting for that time when everybody is on."

Senior Greg Flores was, scoring 15 points. Kimble finished with 14, point guard Nick Hansen scored eight and Enochs had seven

The Cats visited Buhler Tuesday night, Ian 13, but the Crisaders held MHS off in a 42.30 home win. In that one Kimble and Gavin Snider led the way with nine points each
