Rose Hill's Rockets won the tournament title by sweeping the other three teams in the round-robin meet. Three Rockets, all juniors, also were selected to the six-member tournament team by tournament officials. They were center Dennis Shirley, who scored 44 points, Blake Ringwall and James Hensley. They scored 22 aprece in the week-long event.

The final two all-tournament selections were Andale's Paul Eck, who scored a tournament high 70 points, and Derick Keith of Douglass, who scored 45

"Our kids started getting less and less aggressive after that first quarter," said Herrs "At times, it looks like they lay back and hope somebody else shoots it. It's kind of the team psyche. The Rockets took off from the opening tip, It was 15-6, after one quarter and Mulvane didn't score in double digits in any quarter until the 4th, when the Cats scored 15.

Kimble finished with 15 points and reserve Logan Sorensen and Gavin Snider had five points apiece

The Cats played better in the tourney opener against the Bulldogs, out-scoring Douglass, 31-26, in the final half to maintain a nice lead.

Gavin Snider scored 16 points in that game and Hansen tossed in 12. Grant Snider scored nine points, Kimble had seven and J.D. Sorensen finished with five.

The final game of 2003 finds the Wildcats at home against Augusta's Orioles. The game will be held Friday, Dec. 19, and is the first Chisholm Trail League game for both teams.
