Three consecutive one-out errors in the last inning of the second game enabled RH to come from behind. Mulvane had

taken a 15-12 lead into the last frame. Both Kim Kysar and Kim Prickett rapped homers in the game.

The Cats had dropped a 12-6 game to the Rockets Saturday, April 16, in the first game of the Wichita Northwest Softball Tournament at Two Rivers Youth Complex. Mulvane came back to lose by that same count to Northwest before clipping Goddard, 14-11, in the tourney finale.

Against Goddard, the Wildcats scored 10 runs in the fourth and fifth innings to take charge, then had to hang on as the Lions rallied in the top of the sixth for four runs to tighten the game up. Shanda Vangas went 4-for-5 and scored four runs, Shellene Palmer went 5-for-5 and scored four times. Kim Kysar was 4-for-5 with five RBIs and Stacey Palmer slammed her first homer of the season in the six-run fourth.
