

Doubleheader Sweep

Wildcat Softballers Wipe Up El Dorado

The Wildcat girls got things rolling Thursday, April 28, when El Dorado came to town. The Cats swept both ends of a doubleheader against El Dorado, winning by a 7-3 count in the opener and rolling behind a 10-run explosion in the nightcap, 14-2.

The double victory snapped a three-game losing streak and allowed Winners' gals to improve their record to 6-7.

"We were a little slow getting started but once we got rolling, we were playing well," said Winter. "It was probably our best defensive games in a long time. We cut down on both our walks and errors, and we had 13 stolen bases in the first game."

Mulvane broke out of a tight game by scoring three runs in the bottom of the fourth inning in the opener. Heather Donaldson had a two-run single to make it 5-1. Kandi Miller's sacrifice fly made it 3-1 moments earlier.

In the second game, Kim Prickett rapped a two-run triple in the third inning to bring the Cats from a 2-1 deficit to the lead. Mulvane then broke the game open big time with 10 runs in

the sixth inning. Kim Kysar had a bases-loaded triple and pinch-hitter Sherri Ranger singled with the bases jammed for two more runs in the frame.

Delinda Gonzalez at third base and Stacey Palmer at first were defensive standouts in the nightcap.

"Kandi Miller played well in leftfield in both games and (centerfielder) Heather Donaldson did a good job, our best defensive player in both games," added Winter. "Shanda (Vangas) also pitched by far her best game of the season and Shellene Palmer had her best game at catcher. We didn't have any walks and passed balls which have been troubling us before."

The Wildcats will play at Goddard today (May 5) in a doubleheader starting at 4 p.m.
