# RH Rockets Spoil Cat Comeback; Girls Open Classic With Andale

One bounce of the basketball, one misfire, one free throw.

That's what the Mulvane-Rose Hill girls basketball game got down to Friday night, Jan. 14, in Rose Hill.

But in the end, it was just another good measurement of progress for the Cats.

The Rockets held off a late surge by the Mulvane Wildcats, who were down by five with a minute to play. Rose Hill held on, though, and recorded a 54-53 victory in Rose Hill as Mulvane standout Abby Sorensen misfired on the second of two free throws.

Earlier this season, the Rockets beat the Cats by 10, 48-38, on a neutral floor.

When you're on their court, you have to

take advantage of every opportunity and we didn't do that," pointed out Cat Coach Dale Landes. "We felt like their quickness was going to be a problem for us and to overcome that, we had to take advantage of every break but we didn't get many. Every bounce, every loose ball seemed to go their way."

For the first half, it appeared the Wildeats could pull off the road win. Using a good 1st quarter, the Wildeats led much of the first half but by intermission, the Rockets had tied the game at 27s. Down the stretch, the Cats' battled their way back into the game before the missed free throw and the failure to create a foul in the last six seconds ended it.

"We played good basketball, about as good as we could considering the entire game," said Landes. "Things were looking good until Abby got into foul trouble in the second quarter and that gave them an opening."

Sorensen picked up her 3rd foul with about three minutes left before intermission and Mulvane leading the game. "With her out, our offense went stagnant for a while and that gave Rose Hill an opening," said the Cat coach. "One thing we talked about at halftime was to get more production out of our bench and we did that in the second half. It just came down to a bounce of the basketball. We had a little misfortune with the missed free throw, then we didn't get anybody fouled so the last six seconds ticked off."

Bench help came from junior Megan Turner, who had her best game with 10 points and some solid defensive work. Junior Kristi Parker gave Landes some good minutes and scored six points.

"We were a lot more aggressive offensively than we were at Buhler," said Landes. "We knew Rose Hill would give us some match-up problems but every time we got our hand on the basketball, it bounced to them, and we didn't get a lot of calls going our way in the first half."

With under a minute left, juniors Josey Gosch and Tara Roberts downed shots that brought the Cats within striking distance and the Wildcats had an opportunity with about 29 seconds left to take the lead. "We had the ball and had a set play called," said
