Girls Stop Crusaders

Whiz Gee Too Much For Cats

The Mulvane High School girls' basketball team ran into a brick wall at #3-ranked Andover Central Tuesday night, Feb. 6.

The host Jaguars (14-1) busted the game open with a 19-4 second-quarter advantage on their way to a 58-26 win over the Wildcats, dropping Mulvane's record to 3-12 overall on the season.

Specifically, the wall Mulvane ran into was named Bailey Gee. A 5-11 sophomore, Gee scored 31 points, over half her team's total. Gee was the only player to score in double figures for either team.

The Wildcats were held to 12 field goals and were only 2-for-11 from the free-throw line. Junior Melinda McKee led the Wildcats with eight points. Mulvane also got four points each from Amanda Burrell, Taylor Parsons, and Whitney Sullivan, and two each from Courtney Becker, Maddie Wise, and Stephanie Wilson.

The Wildcats broke a three-game losing streak Friday night, Feb. 2, with a 40-35 win at home over Wellington. As for keys to the victory, it was really pretty simple.

"Coming into the game, we knew we'd



have to contain their best player (Courtney Goodrum)," said Wildcat head coach Dale Landes. "She's been a very good four-year starter for them, and she's their most dangerous offensive weapon. I thought Katie Ybarra did a very good defensive job on Goodrum. We wanted her to earn her points, and we wanted to make someone else on their team beat us. I thought we did a good job of that."

Both teams started slowly, with Wellington leading 6-4 after one quarter. The Wildcats got their offensive flow going in the second period, eventually taking a 16-12 lead by halftime. The Lady Dukes kept the game close, cutting the lead down to 24-21 by the end of the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, the 'Cats kept Wellington at arm's length by making eight of 13 free-throw attempts. For the game, Mulvane was 16-for-25 (64%) from the line.

Sophomore Wise and freshman Parsons each scored 11 points to lead the Wildcats. Another freshman, Wilson, added eight points. Mulvane also got five points from McKee, four from Becker, and one from Ybarra. Goodrum led all scorers with 16 points for Wellington, but she only hit five shots from the floor.

"We wanted to work the ball inside to Taylor and Courtney, then bring it back out if necessary," said Landes. "We got 15 points from our inside players, and we got 19 points from our two freshmen. We're slowly improving as a team, but we're still showing signs of inconsistency, which you have to expect at times with a team this young."

The Mulvane junior varsity, coached by Brad Canfield, also picked up a win against Wellington, 49-22. The 'Cats used a 17-6 second-quarter advantage to open up a big early lead. The Wildcats got 11 points from Kaitlin Lanzrath, nine from Kendra Reusser, eight from Amanda Burrell, seven from Stephanie Wilson, and four from Lindsey Ring.

The Wildcats will have their Homecoming game Friday night, Feb. 9, against Rose Hill. The game is scheduled to start at 6 p.m.
