The Mulvane High School basketball girls went from their worst game of the year to their best

And it only took three days to get there -

The Wildcat gals were coming off their lowest offensive production of the 2004-05 season 26 points against El Dorado. It was a different story Friday night. Dec. 17 at home against Wellington. The Cats were chicking on all cylinders and racked up a 55-47.

That's more points in one game than the MHS girls have scored in the last 46 games dating back to their first game of the 2005 03 season when the Cars lost in overtime to Kingman, 65-62

"That's the way we should play all the time," said Coach Dale Landes, who's team boosted its record to 2.4 heading area to holiday break. "We were pretty much up tempo, our defense was more interse and our offense was patient when we didn ( get shots off our fastbreak, fivery aspect of our game improved from our last outher."

The Crusaders took the early lead but the Cats roared back in the 2nd and 3rd quarters. The 3rd quarters was pivotal as the Wildcats out-scored Wellington, 18 9 to build a 10-point lead.

"Our defense caused a few farnovers and our fastbreak helped widen the gap for us said Landes. "Just the day before in practice, we put in a half-court trap and that seemed to throw them off just enough to get a few turnovers and scores to get some momentum going."

Balance was the big word for the Cats On offense, seven players scored with guard Tara Roberts tossing in a game-high 17 points. Abby Sorensen finished with 14 for the Cats and Whitney Becker added eight Laura Buchanan, Josey Gosch and Kristi Parker each chipped in four points, too.

"What that half-court trap allowed us to do was pressure them a little bit and make them take shots they were uncomfortable taking," said Landes. "Once we got into the late stages of the game with the lead, the girls knew what to do. We wanted to have Abby handling the ball as much as possible. She's a good free throw shooter and handles the ball. That made it tough for them to make up much ground on us."

And what's up at the free throw line? The Wildcats were 12 out of 13 from the stripe. The charity stripe has been a source of despair for Landes and the Wildcats in the last two ball games. The numbers for the last three games have been 6-for-17, 4-for-12 and 12-for-25. Friday night, however, the free throw line was user-friendly. 'These girls can hit the free throws, it's just a matter of doing it game-in and game-out," said Landes.

"Our bench really did a tremendous job, too," added Coach Landes. "Kristi Parker came in there and gave us some great minutes and so did Keeper Thompson."

The Mulvane jayvee team hit 9 out of 13 free throws in the last quarter and rallied to a 36-32 friumph over Wellington's JV team. Megan Turner led the scoring for the Cats with 13 points but it was Whitney Sullivan at the stripe with seven 4th quarter free
