Young had three hits in the second game in addition to holding Goddard to seven hits. He also scored twice. Chad Phipps had a pair of hits and two RBIs and Sean Gillespie had a hit and two RBIs in addition to several good catches in centerfield.

The Wildca's struggled in a doubleheader loss to Rose Hill Thursday, April 13, in Mulvane. The Rockets swept the two Chisholm Trail League games, 19-5, and, 25-18, in extra innings in the second game which spoiled a stirring comeback by Mulvane.

Rose Hill banged the Cat staff for 19 hits in the first game and added 16 more in the nightcap. A nine-run explosion in the second and third innings put RH in charge in the opener and the visitors closed things off with six runs in the sixth inning.

In the second game, Mulvane scored nine runs in the bottom of the seventh inning in one of the better comebacks you'll see, but Rose Hill pushed across seven in the top of the first extra inning to regain control of the game.

In the opener, Sean Gillespie's solo homer keyed a two-run second. Scott Young finished with two hits and Gillespie, Jeremy Miller and Robbie Swindle had one apiece.

Scott Proctor had three hits and scored four runs in the nightcap and Swindle had two hits and scored twice. Scott Young scored three runs.

The nine-run seventh featured RBI hits by Proctor and Adam Morris, two-run hits by Young and catcher Chad Phipps and a bases-clearing, three-run triple by Proctor to cap it.
