## HS Strikes Quickly, Chalks Up 3 More

It was all over but the shouting after a grand slam homer in the first iming for the Mulvane High School baseballers Monday night, April 29, at Rose Hill.

And the Wildcats did plenty of shouting after the homer, too, as they buried Rose Hill under an avalanche of runs in a Chisholm Trail League doubleheader sweep. The Cats battered RH, 18-2, in the first game, then routed the host Rockets, 19-3, in the nightcap.

The double victory left the MHS baseball record at a sparkling 12-6 heading into a make-up game against a strong Nickerson Panthers. That game will be held at 5 p.m. Monday, May 6, at the Mulvane sports complex.

"We had to go out and take care of business at Rose Hill and that's what we did," stressed Dave Katzenmeier, the veteran Mulvane diamond chief. "And it didn't hurt to start with the big blast by Oldridge."

A junior, Jarrod Oldridge started the fireworks for the Cats when he connected on a grand slam homer in the first inning at Rose Hill. Larry Dixson had walked and Robert Glaser singled before Chuck Rollins loaded the sacks with a walk. Oldridge, who finished the game with six RBIs and two hits, connected on a 3-1 pitch.

The Cats scored nine more in the 3rd to turn the game into batting practice with singles by Chad Nichols, Gary Cleverdon, Neil Andersen and Dixson scored runs and Oldridge and Steve Nelson had two RBI singles in the inning.

The Wildcats banged out 11 hits, including two each by Rollins, Oldridge and Nichols.

That was plenty good enough for the fine pitching of Jamie Belden, who scattered four hits against the hapless Rockets, who have won only one game this season. He walked only two.

Sophomore Robert Glaser turned in his best mound job of the year in the second game as he scattered six hits and didn't walk a batter. RH got only one hit after getting five off Glaser in a shaky first inning.

Mulvane exploded for eight runs in the first inning and had a 13-3 lead after just two frames. In the first, Dixson singled, Glaser reached on an error and Rollins
