"We're just not getting the job done right now," confessed David Katzenmeier, the MHS baseball field manager. "We just need to keep hanging in there and keep working."

Those losses saw the Mulvane record dip to 4-11.

"We just let the first game get away from us," noted Katzenmeier about the opener against RH. "In game two, we had some opportunities but didn't cash in on them. We had the bases loaded a time or two in a 3-3 game but didn't get the job done. Those are the times you have to step up and produce."
