## MHS Baseballers Own Worst Enemy

The Mulvane baseball team got beat and lost last week.

There is a big difference to coach Dave Katzenmeier.

"I don't mind getting beat," he said.

The Wildcats were hammered by Goddard Monday, April 24 by scores of 13-3 and 13-1.

"It was more ourselves than anything else," Katzenmeier said. "I think they were a little better than normal and we were a lot worse."

The Lions jumped out to a 3-0 lead after one inning, but the Wildcats battled back.

Michael Abasolo sliced a single in the third inning and was driven home when Tom Nienke drove the ball over the leftfield fence. The two run tied the game at three.

It was 5-3 heading into the bottom of the fifth inning.

"That inning started nasty and gradually got worse," Katzenmeier said.

"We just booted it around in key situations," Katzenmeier said. "I was pretty happy with the way we played."

Joe Flowers kept the Wildcats close by

pitching five solid innings, giving up only three earned runs.

"I was real happy with his control," Katzenmeier said. "It was just the little things that got us. They are a good team."

With Scott Sanchez on base in the first inning, Nienke continued his power surge of late, smacking another home run.

"He just missed another one in the third inning," Katzenmeier said.

Mulvane could only muster one hit, a Sean Younger double, after the first inning.

The Orioles scored four quick runs in the second game, but Mulvane came back in the second game. McDowell knocked in two runs with a double, then Abasolo plated McDowell with a single.

However, Mulvane again fizzled from the plate later in the game.

Katzenmeier was able to accomplish something in the games.

"We played a lot of people, in case we need them as a pinch-hitter or defensively later in the season," he said. "We don't want them to come in cold turkey."

The jayvee picked up two more wins, 3-0 and 5-1, versus Augusta.
