The Wildcats continued to score in the fourth when McDowell doubled to score Scott Sanchez and put Mulvane ahead 4-1.

Nickerson came back in the top half of the fifth to score three, tying the game.

The Wildcats again answered. Chad Nulik led of the Wildcats half of the fifth with a single, scoring on a well-hit double from Eric Erbert.

Erbert would come around to score on a Sanchez single.

"I was glad to see Eric come through in the inning," Katzenmeier said. "He has had a tough year at times. Hopefully it's coming around for him."

Casey Myers relieved starter Tim Glaser in the fourth inning and shut the door with three innings of hitless work, allowing only one run on wild pitches.

"Both of them did a great job," Katzenmeier said. "It was nice to see Tim back on the mound after three weeks off with injuries."

Pete Myers came in to stop the Panther attack, not allowing a single hit in four innings.


"He was very impressive," Katzenmeier said. "He didn't walk anyone either. He pitched strikes, which keeps the defense on their toes, as well."
