Thursday's solo game was played at the Mulvane sports complex because Circle's field was in bad condition. The victory left Coach Rash's Cats at 13-7 for the regular season, and 8-6 in the Chisholm Trail League, which tied the MHS boys with Wellington for second place.

Mulvane exploded for seven runs in the third inning, and it wasn't close after that. "It was a nice win for us," said Rash. "we played four innings of real good baseball and we had one inning where we had a few mental mistakes and errors that let them score some runs they shouldn't have, but I think the kids have played fairly consistently all season long."

Mulvane banged out 14 hits and junior Ryan Rogers did the rest, shutting down the T-Birds on only two hits. He walked only one, and none of the runs were earned.

"Our hitting has really been coming on lately," said Rash. "We've had some big innings. It's been contagious. One guy will start hitting, then another and another. In this one, though, we got a lot of help. We had a lot of hard hits against Circle. We actually should have scored more runs because we hit a lot of balls right at them early. We showed good balance up and down the line-up, too. Everybody has been pretty strong. Our 7-8-9 batters have been producing as much as our 1-2-3 at times. Darrin Erbert had an excellent game. Chad Gerwick had a good game and Brian Minks had a nice two-run hit that kind of broke the game open for us."

Todd Fagan delivered an RBI single but was picked off. That was followed by a single by Johnson, who scored the last run on an error and a passed ball.

Phipps finished with a 3-for-4 game, scoring three times and knocking in two runs. The junior Schumacher had two hits, three RBIs and scored twice and both Myers and Erbert had two hits.
