## Wake-Up Call For Cat Bats

The alarm went off a few days earlier. By Monday night, April 15, the Mulvane High School bats were all awake.

Thanks for the wake-up call!

The Wildcats had their most explosive offense going Monday against the Indians from Clearwater in a non-league game. The Cats swept both ends of the twinbill, 13-0 and 11-1, giving Coach Ramon Wiseman's club four wins in a row.

The Cats exploded for 16 hits, including five for extra bases, in the opener against Clearwater. That made things extremely easy for starting pitcher Jimmie High, who

tossed a two-hit shutout and fanned six.

Designated hitter Andrew Bruso lit the fuse in the very first inning when he clubbed a three-run homer but the Cats put the game in the book in the next inning, scoring eight more times. The big hits in that inning were RBI singles by Pat Myers and High, an RBI double by Ryan Tatum, an RBI triple by Austin Higinbotham and a two-run triple by Luke Gunter.

Dan MacKay went 2-for-3 with one run scored, Higinbotham was 2-for-3 and both High and Gunter were 2-for-2.

The Mulvane hot streak continued in game No. 2 and once again, it was Bruso who got it going, slashing a two-run triple in the first inning after Greg Flores had walked and Gunter had reached on an error.

The Cats had another big inning to put the game away. Pat Myers singled with two out to start the six-run 4th inning. Jeff Wohlford singled and both scored on a Higinbotham double. Flores singled for a run and Gunter singled for a run. After Jake Myers walked, both Gunter and Myers were balked over a base before Bruso's big bat came into play with a two-bagger that scored two.

Freshman Logan Sorensen was on the receiving end of that good fortune, but he did pitch well, giving up only three hits and walking none to pick up his second straight win.

The MHS baseball boys finally broke through with a pair of victories over hithappy Oxford Saturday, April 13, at the Mulvane sports complex. Mulvane pitching shut down the Oxford hitters, though, as the Cats took both ends of a doubleheader, 3-2 and 8-0, snapping the team's eight-game

"Those wins were long over-due," confessed Wiseman. "I told the kids before the game that we were just a base hit or two or a couple of breaks away from having four or five other wins. We've been getting great hitting and that continued against Oxford. Pat (Myers) had a no-hitter going into the last inning or two and Austin (Higinbotham) did a nice job in the first game.

"Will this get us going? I certainly hope so. We know we have a pretty good squad. It has taken us a little time getting our defense down but Saturday, we didn't make an error in either game. We moved Luke Gunter to shortstop and Jimmie High to the outfield. Jimmie is a great outfielder, but we never knew it until Saturday." Speaking of errors, the Wildcats won the


first one on an Oxford error in the final inning. Higinbotham and William Fagan were both hit by pitches and with no outs and Gunter at the plate in the bottom of the 7th, Higinbotham stole third and trotted home when the throw went into the outfield, ending the 3-2 game.

Senior catcher Ryan Tatum went 2-for-3 and Gunter was 1-for-1 with one RBI, which

was enough to back Higinbotham's six-hitter. He fanned four and walked only two. Myers had everything under control in game No. 2, striking out 11 and walking

only one. Oxford's only hits were back-toback singles in the 6th. Mulvane, meanwhile, scored three times in the first when Fagan and Gunter walked and Jake Myers doubled them home.
