The action was the first for Mulvane since before the holiday vacation and the Cats looked rusty as Buhler sailed out to a 14-7 lead after one quarter. Mulvane stayed close the rest of the way, going into the final period only four points down, 39-35, but the Crusaders pulled away by nailing their free throws in the fourth quarter.

The Mulvane junior varsity also tasted defeat as Buhler ran away with a 62-36 triumph, but the Cat sophomores came from behind on two free throws by Jeremy Baker to claim their first winner of the year, a 31-30 victory.

"We talked about not fouling before the game and we talked about not making the unforced errors but those are the two things that got us into trouble," admitted MHS coach Charlie Mason. "That was the difference. The game was actually pretty close until the last few minutes. Their depth and free throws caught up with us."

Mason said it was encouraging to stay close to the Crusaders. "It was encouraging but we have to stop beating ourselves," said Mason. "The kids know it. We don't play anybody weak on our schedule, so you can't help them by turning the ball over."

Senior Derek Donaldson turned in his best game of the season for Mulvane, hitting for 13 points. Senior Sean Gillespie scored 11 points and Larry Lambrecht, another senior, was held to 10 points.

The junior varsity never could get untracked against the Crusaders. Curtis Norden was high with 10 points, Scott Travis scored nine and Andy Church had nine for the jayvees.

Toby Hoving and Andy Mackey paced the MHS sophomores to victory. Each scored 12 points as Mulvane overcame a 14-5 halftime advantage in the second half culminated by Baker's two free throws with eight seconds left to win the game.
