"They put extreme pressure on us, which is what we wanted because it helps set up the (slow down) offense even more," said Mason. "We were getting the short we wanted earlier but we missed them. We missed five lay-ups in the first quarter and when that happens and they come down and score, that takes the game out of our hands."

The Crusaders, now 3-0 in the league, jumped shead but didn't start rolling up the big numbers until the second quarter when Buhler out-scored-Mulvane, 22-13.

"We talked about wanting to slow it down at halftime but we can out and didn't do anything," said Mason. "We got caught up in their running game and fell right into it."

In the early going, Mulvane was staying close but missed shots kept giving Buhler an opportunity to enlarge its lead and the game turned into a rout in the last half as Mulvane's offense went even colder, scoring only 14 points the entire half.

"It didn't help to have them making a tremendous percentage from the field in the second half because we went completely cold," said Mason. "We hit six of eight from the line in the first half but we were only three of 12 in the second half."

Junior Jeff Parson led the scoring for the Wildcat varsity. He had 13 points. Gary Cleverdon scored eight points, Chris-Wagoner scored seven and Jarrod Oldridge and Andy Mackey had five and four, respectively.

The jayvees got knocked on their heels in the first quarter, then came back to play well the rest of the way. Buhler bolted to a 23-9 lead after one period.

J.J. Dunn and Brian Strack were the lone double figure scorers for the Cat jayvees. Dunn scored 12 and Strack had 10. Chad Carpenter and David Boyer scored eight points each for Coach Dale Landes' outfit.

The sophomore Cats picked up their first victory of the year in handy fashion, pushing past the Crusaders to lead by 11 at intermission. Coach David Belew's Cats are 1-1 this season.

Guard Brian Strack had a field day, hitting a career-high 20 points. Tim Richardson popped in 10 points, Jeremy Kendrick scored nine, hitting three threepointers, and Robert Glaser scored eight.

The Wildcat boys will play a make-up game at Augusta Monday, Jan. 14, the school announced earlier this week. The games originally were to have been played Friday, Jan. 4, but icy roads forced a postponement.

There will be one change in the timetable. The sophomore game against Augusta will still commence at 4:30 p.m. Monday at the high school in Augusta. However, the boys minior varsity game will be played beginning

at 4 p.m. and it will be played at the Augusta Middle School because of a scheduling conflict at the high school.
