"The kids played them tough," testified Mason. "This was the first game all year where we were in it in the fourth quarter. The kids felt the loss and that shows me they care and they're trying. I was very pleased with the effort. We had talked about becoming more aggressive and more physical and I think we were both. Augusta had to work for everything they got."

Still, it was the 6th consecutive loss for the Wildcats. Augusta won its 5th in seven tries.

A dry spell in the third quarter killed Mulvane's hopes of breaking out of the doldrums. The Cats scored five points in the early stages of the third quarter but didn't score the last half of the quarter to fall farther behind.

"That dry spell sure hurt us," admitted Mason. "It was a big disappointment. We got mentally tired, I think, and started making some mistakes that took us right out of the ball game. We handled their three-quarter pressure most of the night but got out of position and didn't do a good job of handling it then. On offense, we didn't have any motion and that let them get the momentum going into the final quarter."

The Cats' pressure defense caught Augusta off-balance and created some opportunity for MHS. "I was real pleased with our presses," said Mason. "For the first time this year, we did a good job all the way. I felt like we needed to try something to create some errors by the other team so we could capitalize on some things."
