The Mulvane High School boys dug a hole, then tried to fill it up but ran out of dirt Tuesday night, Jan. 9, in a Chisholm Trail League outing at Clearwater.

The host Indians raced out to a 12-point lead and Coach Todd Barker's Wildcats spent the rest of the night filling up that hole. They didn't quite get it all filled up as Clearwater squirted out a 69-67 victory in overtime.

"We started playing better after the first quarter as we got our confidence together," said Barker. "Early in the game, I don't even think we showed up."

Back-to-back 20-point quarters in the second and third periods got the Cats back in charge but they couldn't pull away and missed a shot and a rebound shot in the last few seconds of the overtime period that would have won the game.

A key factor once again was rebounding and the taller Cats couldn't dominate on the boards. Clearwater had a 25-20 edge in rebounds. That wiped out an 18-25 edge MHS had in turnovers, according to Barker.


The Wildcat boys got back on track for 1996 by throttling Andale, the pre-season favorite for the CTL crown, 62-47, in a make-up game Friday night, Jan. 5. The game originally was to have been played Dec. 19th but was postponed by bad weather.

"We came out and played really well," emphasized Barker. "We finally decided to rebound the ball. That's been a problem so far this year, but I challenged the kids the other night and they rose to the occasion. We have to use our size better and I thought we did that the other night (against Andale). We tried to work on it in practice more. Rebounding is something that comes from the heart, and we wanted to show more of it."

And they did. The Cats out-boarded Andale, 38-32, with 6-7 Brad Canfield, 6-2 Neil Gosch and 6-2 James Baker each getting seven boards, 6-5 Matt Hendren pulling down six and guard Jeremy Brown cleaning off five rebounds.

The MHS boys made a move in the second quarter and grabbed a seven-point lead by intermission and extended that lead in the final two quarters.

Abasolo led all scorers with 18 points but balance was the secret for Mulvane.

Baker finished with 13 points and three other players—Canfield, Brown and reserve Darrin Erbert—each scored eight points.

The Mulvane junior varsity came out slow and paid for it as the Indians bounced out to a 39-21 lead by intermission. That was enough to give the visitors a 69-55 edge. Raymond Lazier led the scoring for Mulvane with 13 points. Chad Gerwick and Greg Nunn scored seven points apieca.

The Cat sophomores played their first game of the year Friday and edged the Indians, 54-52, as Ryan McCarty scored a career-high 25 points. Gerwick finished with eight points, the same amount as Keene Hargrove, and Ryan Rogers dumped in six points.
