Wildcats Win With Late Surge

A home game with Clearwater was just what Dr. Landes ordered. Boys basketball coach Dale Landes saw his team grab its first win of the season with a 46-41 decision over the Indians Tuesday, Jan. 10.

"I won't say it was a must-win situation, but it was close," Landes said.

It did not come easy, either.

Clearwater jumped out to a quick 6-0 lead behind center David Allenbach. Mulvane would trail or be tied until there was less than two minutes remaining in the game.

The Wildcats offense stagnated early in the game as bad passes and missed lay-ups caused Mulvane to play catch-up basketball. Trailing by 11 points early in the second quarter, Mulvane went on a 10-5 run to pull within six points with two minutes remaining in the half.

Dexter Carpenter scored off a rebound, then assisted Jeff Parker on a shot in the next possession to pull the 'Cats within two. Michael Abasolo scored off an inbounds pass to tie it up at halftime.

"We were worried when Clearwater started hitting outside shots, but we felt we could pressure their guards and that is what we did," Landes said.

The Indians started off the second half like they did the first, with a scoring run to put them back on top. They would lead by five after three quarters.

Jeremy Brown and Shawn Erbert continued to pressure the Indians backcourt and forced Clearwater into tough offensive situations. Brown scored the first four points of the last quarter to bring his team within one point.

Both teams battled evenly for the majority of the quarter until another Carpenter put-back made it Charwater 39-38.

With 1:49 remaining Abasolo drained a three-pointer to give Mulvane it's first lead of the game.

"That was a big shot," Landes said. "That allowed us to take our time and control the tempo for the last minute and a half."

Although Abasolo had missed his previous three three-point attempts in the game, he was confident about the big shot.

"There was no way I was going to miss that one," Abasolo said.

After Carpenter's third baby hook of the game, Mulvane ran out the rest of the clock behind three late free throws from Erbert.

Carpenter finished with a team-high 14 points.
