The undefeated Buhler Crusaders got their assembly line going early and had an easy time whipping Mulvane, 92-48, Tuesday night, Jan. 11, in a Chisholm Trail League game at Buhler.

The Cat junior varsity also hit the skids, 62-43.

"As far as I'm concerned, that was the best Class 5A team in the State of Kansas," said Mason. "They just keep coming at you." It was 27-8 after one period.

Junior Todd Travis notched 16 points and a team-high six rebounds. Sophomore Lonny Travis was the only other double-figure scorer, hitting 13.

Four players scored eight points aplece for Coach Dennis Tegethoff's Cat jayvees--Greg Quigley, Terry Reusser, Bo Jones and David Kramer.

The Wildcats came off their Christmas break Friday night, Jan. 7, with a rusty performance at home against Augusta. The Orioles trounced Mulvane, 52-36, in what was Mulvane's worst offensive performance of the season.

"It's the worst ball game we've played all year from a team standpoint," complained Mason. "We didn't have just one player off, we had everybody. I thought we were ready but obviously, we weren't."
