

Augusta Pins First Loss On Mulvane

Two Chisholm Trail League teams went into last Friday's contest undefeated and although one emerged with a still perfect record, the other was not hurt by the loss in any aspect other than the appearance of 0-1 in than the appearance of a 1 in the place of a 0 in the loss column.
