## Winless Lions

Mulvane blew open Tuesday night's game against Goddard in a hurry, then had to survive a late run by the Lions to claim a 70-54 victory in a Chisholm Trail League outing at home.

The Mulvane boys jumped all over the

visitors in the first two quarters, taking a 31-16 halftime lead and held winless Goddard off down the home stretch to notch their second straight win to improve their record to 3-6 overall and 2-3 in the Chisholm Trail.

"It was a case of getting up too much too early and we lost our concentration" confessed Mason. "We had trouble in the second half with their man-to-man pressure and let them back in the game, but we made our free throws down the stretch. I told the kids before the season started that we could be the best free throw shooting team Mulvane's had in a long time but when the first league statistics came out we were last. The last two games, though, we've shot pretty good at the line.' Against the 0-8 Lions, the Wildcats

dropped 24 of 36 through the hoop and it proved to be the difference.

The Cats were again paced by seniors Shay Cornejo and Toby Cornéjo scored 25 points and Butcher had 22. "Toby's really had some good games inside lately," said Mason, "even though he's been out-manned about every time out. He's done an excellent job for us this year inside."

Guard Neal Hamilton was next-high with 11 points and forward Larry Lambrecht, a junior, popped in eight points.

The Mulvane boys played their best game to date Friday, Jan. 8, at Wellington, where they toppled the hot Crusaders, 83-70, in a Chisholm Trail League game. It was the first CTL win for Mulvane this season. "It was an important victory, but they

all start to become important now, stressed Mason. "We need seven or eight wins to insure us of a home game for the first round of the sub-state, and we have nine left. We need to have at least five more before they seed, so they're all important.' Mason also was looking at the league

a tough ball game with Wellington, if they're not emotionally tough; they're physically tough." Mulvane maintained a double-figure lead most of the way with everybody who played contributing in some way. Cornejo finished with a team-high 26 and he had numerous assists and rebounds. Center Toby Butcher looked good inside, scoring 19 points. Guard

Neal Hamilton had a fine floor night and . pumped in 17 points. Russell Norden

had a career-high 15 points, hitting some key free throws down the stretch.

"It was a good team effort, our best," added Mason. "We got some things out of people we needed to get. I think we caught them by surprise, too, because we ran a totally different man offense and press against them than we had earlier this year. It's something we prepared during the Christmas break for Wellington." Mason also was pleased with his club's

free throwing, too. The Cats made 20 of 30 free tosses, their best of the year. "When you're last in the league in free throwing, you can expect to be fouled," said Mason. "They fouled us a lot but it was a pleasure to see us making them." The Wildcat junior varsity had its troubles, blowing an early lead and losing a 69-45 game to the Crusaders.
