# MHS Jubilation Short Lived

With their first win under their belt, the Mulvane High School boys had high hopes of adding Wellington to the list Tuesday night, Jan. 12, at Wellington, but the Crusaders schooled Mulvane in an 84-59 rout.

The Crusaders' Darin Miller proved to be too much as he poured in 40 points, his second-40-point game of the year.

"Too much Darin Miller," admitted MHS coach Dale Landes. "We couldn't stop him and we also had an off-shooting night by our guards. For us to be successful, we have to have our guards more active on the floor.

"We also found out we had to play hard for 32 minutes both on offense and defense if we're going to be successful," added Landes. "It paid off against Valley Center, but we didn't play a high intensity game for 32 minutes against Wellington and that's something we need to do every single time out to be competitive."

Defensively, Mulvane couldn't match up with the 6-foot, 7-inch Miller. "We wanted to double down on him every time he got the ball and either force him to take a bad shot or to pass off," pointed out Landes. "What happened is he started passing off and their other people started hitting three-pointers. They had six of them in the first two quarters. When we adjusted for that, Miller took advantage of it."

Senior J.J. Dunn had his best scoring night of the year, which was one positive for the Cats. He finished with 15 points. Senior Brian Heinrichs scored 14 points, Dan Smith and Brian Strack had eight apiece and Steve Nelson scored five.

"Nelson had a pretty good game with eight assists and only one turnover, and I was glad to see J.J. and Brian (Heinrichs) step up, but we have to have that kind of scoring from everybody," added Landes.

Mulvane returned the favor in the junior varsity game. The Wildcats held on for a 55-47 victory after taking a 14-point lead into the last eight minutes of play.

Chris Heersche topped Mulvane's jayvee scorers. He had 14 points. Shay Vangas finished with 11 points and both Shawn Erbert and Dexter Carpenter had 10-point games.

point Friday night, Jan. 8, by freezing out Valley Center, 57-56, for their first victory of the season.

That exclamation point was a three-point goal by senior Jeremy Kendrick, followed by two free throws with nine seconds left, giving Mulvane its first victory since last January's Roadrunner Classic winner over Chaparral, a 50-45 decision.

The game also afforded Coach Landes with his first head coaching victory after seven straight setbacks and gave the Cat seniors their first victory ever over Valley Center.

"It was obviously a big, big win for our program and for the seniors," said Landes, whose Wildcats improved to 1-7 overall and 1-2 in the Chisholm Trail. "We would have liked to have had a couple wins at the Circle

tournament but it didn't happen, but it's still good to get one against Valley."

Landes said the biggest single factor was that his Wildcats played high intensity basketball for 32 minutes. "That's a first," said Landes. "We have played in spurts at a high intensity level but never the whole game. We took advantage of their ball handling skills and pressed the whole game."

The MHS coach also felt his team executed on offense for the first time this season. "That goes back to intensity, too," said Landes. "As long as we stay focused and intense, it shows on the offensive and defensive ends, and it showed Friday night."

Getting back to Kendrick, the senior had his "finest hour." He came off the bench and scored 11 points, including three three-pointers, two of them coming in the fourth quarter when Mulvane was pushing to regain the lead. His three-point goal brought the Cats back to within one, 56-55, then Kendrick frosted the celebration cake by hitting both ends of the one-and one for the

winning points.

"Jeremy also did it with his defense, taking a charge late in the game, so he really stepped up defensively," added Landes.

With big center Jason DeWald sidelined because of illness, Landes went to a three-guard motion offense and the Mulvane guards came through. Strack finished with a team-high 13 points. Behind Kendrick's 11 points, Nelson had six, J.J. Dunn had seven and Brian Heinrichs had eight. Reserves Chris Heersche and Larry Dixson had four points each.

The MHS junior varsity stumbled early against the Valley jayvees, and the visiting Hornets blitzed the Cats, 80-47. Heersche's 12 points highlighted the Mulvane offense. Dexter Carpenter finished with 10 points, Griff Comejo scored eight and Shay Vangas had seven for coach Scott Swaney's jayvees.

Mulvane made it a 2-1 night, however, when the Mulvane sophomores held on against a furious VC rally in the fourth quarter to claim a 52-44 victory. Mulvane bolted to the head of the class in the first quarter, out-scoring the Hornets, 18-4, behind Tom Nienke's seven points and five by Carpenter.

Top scorer for the Cat sophs was Shawn Erbert with 10 points. Kevin Diller scored nine points as did Nienke, and Rick Maxwell had eight points before fouling out.

The Wildcats will be on the road Friday night, Jan. 15, with Maize as the host.
