

# Goddard Lions Hand Wildcats CTL Loss

A combination of cold shooting and Goddard's superior height was too much for the Mulvane Wildcats last Friday. The tall Lions sped out to a 75-50 Chisholm Trail League win.

Mulvane got off to a good start and led for much of the first period. Later in the stanza, Goddard forged ahead, 15-14 and that was about the end of the line for the Cats.

Two factors helped Mulvane in the initial quarter. First, Goddard's 6-9 center, Mickey Ogden picked up a couple of quick fouls and left the game. This, coupled with hitting 7 field goals out of 15 attempts put Mulvane in the contest.

Things changed rapidly when Ogden returned. The 6-9 postman hit four quick baskets in the early part of the second quarter and blocked a couple of shots. Also, during the second period, the Cats could muster just three field goals out of 18 attempts. By intermission, Goddard led 35-22.

Goddard increased its lead to 56-34 at the end of the third period. A couple of times, the Cats cut their lead to 18, but just couldn't muster a serious challenge.

Kent Hughes provided the Cats with one bright spot. The 5-11 junior canned 26 points to lead the scoring. Hughes alternated between hitting long jump shots and short drives.

Another of Mulvane's problems was the absence of Mark Cranston, 6-4 forward, he will be out of action for at least two weeks due to illness. Earlier, he missed three games due to an ankle injury.

David McKinney, the hustling 6-0 forward, paced the rebounding with nine. Others on
