Wildcat Rally Falls Short,

Pressing Defense Sparks Boys

A scrappy band of Mulvane High School boys nearly pulled the plug on Buhler's victory party but the host Crusaders held on for a 77-67 decision Friday night, Jan. 10, in a Chisholm Trail League Division I game.

Coach Charlie Mason's Wildcats fell out of contention through the first three quarters by almost 20 points, but the Cats applied the heat in the final quarter and rallied to within three points, 68-65, with under 2:30 left. Buhler then made its free throws and pulled away in the final 30 seconds.

The next game for the Cats will be tonight (Jan. 16) at Maize in a make-up game. The game originally had been scheduled for Dec. 10 but was weathered out.

"You hate to lose, especially when you come so close," admitted Mason, whose band of cagers tumbled to 2-4 for the year and 0-2 in the CTL. "But we improved. We came close to beating

them, which is something we didn't do the last two years. I didn't know, quite honestly, if we could press them. When we tried it early in the game, they went right through us but we picked up the intensity in the 4th quarter and worked harder."

Early, the Crusaders (4-4) built up a big lead as Mulvane had all sorts of trouble rebounding against the taller Buhler team. Buhler finished with a 39-27 edge in rebounding, including 16 rebounds which helped the hosts shoot 59% from the field. Off-setting that, however, was 30 forced turnovers by Buhler and only 18 for MHS.

"I'll tell you one thing, it wasn't a 10-point ball game," added Mason. "We were bucking a lot of size and we didn't get any breaks, especially late in the game. We went to our pressure defense and the kids really did a good job with it. The difference in the game was their size. We stressed blocking out and worked hard at it but sometimes the bigger kids get away with going over the top of our smaller kids and Buhler did. Still, I can't be too unhappy with the effort. We improved quite a bit. It' was our first game since the Christmas break and Buhler already has played once since then.'
