## Cats' Home 'Sweet'

The phrase "Home, Sweet Home" never met more than Friday night, Jan. 11, when the Mulvane High School basketball boys. made their first step at regaining an edge at home.

Mulvane won its first home game in nearly two seasons, charging back from a poor start to swing past Andover Central. 58-48, in a non-league game in Mulvane. The last Cat home win came Feb. 18, 2000, in Coach John Darrow's first and only seasons here when the Wildcats rose up against Rose Hill, 58-41. Since that victory. Mulvane had lost 12 in a row at home.

"It was a great win for our program from that standpoint," emphasized Coach Ryan Herrs, "We got off to a rocky start because we came out turning the ball over and they came out aggressively and hitting their shots. It took little Kale Regier to bring us back. He got us back in the ball game with his shooting."

Regier drained three straight three-pointers after the Wildcats had fallen and couldn't get up. Central's Jaguars had jumped out to an 11-2 lead in the first few minutes of the opening period, but when the dust settled going into the 2nd quarter, the Cats and Jags were tied, 13-13, and Mulvane took off from there.

"That energized our whole team, it was kind of like electro-shock treatment," said Herrs. "It also helped that we were able to take advantage of their pressure. They pressured and Zach Kimble was able to go back door a number of times and that really helped. We actually had a 'run.' I can honestly say that is about the first time I have seen us on a run of three to five baskets in a row."

In the second half, the Wildcats, who finished with 19 turnovers, had only four turnovers, which gave Mulvane more scoring opportunities. "At halftime, we were ahead by two points and had turned the ball over 15 times. Think about how good we could be if we didn't turn the ball over, if we took care of the ball," said Herrs. "Good teams average 10 or under turnovers and right now, we're averaging double that. If we take care of the basketball, we'll win some ball games."

The 48 points by Central represents a season-low figure given up by the MHS boys outside the early-season tournament as they improved their record to 4-5 heading into the 31st annual Chaparral Roadrunner Classic. The Cats are scheduled to play Pratt's Greenbacks (2-6) in the 8 p.m. game tonight (Jan. 17) in the last game of the first round at Chappy. "The tournament doesn't have any

ranked teams in there so everybody's just
