ing his 120th victory for the Green and White. "You're not going to win many ball games doing that no matter how well you play defense, and we didn't play defense very well."

In other words, Mason was pronouncing it an all-around awful night. The Lions sprinted ahead, 13-8, after one quarter and held a 33-21 halftime lead, then put the game on ice in the third quarter by out-scoring Mulvane by five more. Goddard also took advantage of the injury to Mulvane's top scorer, Jeff Sisco, who injured an ankle on the play's final game in the previous game at Buhler.

"We had 15 turnovers in the first half and that was the big difference," said Mason. "That was enough to take us out of the second half. Our press broke down in the second half and although we got some turnovers off it, we gave up some easy baskets."

The offensively-struggling Cats could never recover from that early salvo by the Lions. One of Mulvane's giant problems this season has been putting the ball in the basket. The team is only averaging 44 points a game.

Mason had installed a new motion offense in an effort to get people free for better shots. And while the offensive operation was a success, the patient died.

"We changed to a new offense and this was only the second day of running it,' noted Mason. "We got better shot selection and we had more movement, but we couldn't put the ball in the hole. It's a passing game offense where you have no real post because everybody plays every position. We try to set a lot of screens and get people open that way."

Nothing works, though, if the old shooting eye isn't tuned in.

"We felt like we had a good chance at winning but that chance became more difficult when Sisco couldn't play," emphasized Mason. "We again suited up 10 and all 10 played. That's the standard for the season. We need to get experience for our younger players and this also gives everybody a chance to get in there."

Three Wildcats were in double figures, a first this season. Senior Curtis Norden had another 13-point outing and sophomores Jarrod Oldridge and Gary Cleverdon chipped in 11 and 10 points, respectively. "We just lack the consistency to keep up the scoring," admitted the Cat boss.

The junior varsity also seems to be a little scoring-shy as Goddard pounded out a 66-39 victory. The Lions did plenty of damage in the opening half to take a 38-16 lead before coasting in.

Guard Toby Hoving, a junior, had actine game, scoring 10 points. Jeff Parson scored eight points and Chad Carpenter scored six, but the Wildest scoring leader for the second straight game was junior Andy Mackey with 12 points.

The Wildcat sophomores ran out of gas in the final half, scoring only 15 points after

shooting under 25% as Goddard ripped them, 47-29.

David Boyer scored seven points to pace the Cat sophs. Judson Spicer and Chad Lee both scored six points and Jay Jackson finished with five

In a game at Buhler Tuesday night, Jan. 9, the sophomores were bruised, 55-34, scoring only 14 points in the final half.

Top scorers at Buhler were Spicer with seven points and Carpenter with the same. Chad Lee flipped in six points and both David Boyer and Brian McDonald had five
