

# MHS Boys In Best Showing

Don't ever say Charlie Mason and his Wildcats don't have a sense of obligation. If you owe someone something, pay it back.

That's just what Mason's Mulvane Cats did Thursday night, Jan. 13, in a home high school basketball game with Goddard. The Wildcats responded with their best game of the season and walloped the faltering Lions, 63-51, in a Chisholm Trail League game.

The victory boosted the Cats to 3-5 and 2-3 in CTL play heading into tournament play this week in the Roadrunner Classic at Chaparral. Goddard thumped into last place in the league with an 0-5 mark and 2-6 overall.

The Wildcats nearly made things a clean sweep against Goddard. The sophomore Cats throttled Goddard, 44-33, but the MHS junior varsity lost on a half-court shot at the final buzzer, 47-45.

"We owed them one for running up the score the previous year, besides, we haven't beaten Goddard in a long, long time, not since I've been here," said Mason, who is in his fourth season at the Cats' cage chief. "The kids responded with their best game of the season. Shooting-wise and overall, it was our best. We have 12 different categories we use to try to summarize the games and we made (accomplished) goals in nine of them."

"We changed up on our defenses quite a bit and they are young and inexperienced," added the Mulvane coach. "It took them time to recognize. On offense, we shot our best percentage of the year (57½ with 26 of 46 from the field). They over-played a lot and weren't getting very good weak-side help, so our lobbs over the top netted us a lot of layups.

"Maybe we have the right combination in there now," added Mason, who started two sophomores and three juniors. "The team played like it is capable of playing. J.C. (Shook) got his first start and played a perfect game on offense and held their top scored to only one field goal."

Mason also singled out junior guard Kevin Bell with another top-flight game and Todd Travis, a 6-foot-4 junior who had 13 rebounds, with a fine game. Sophomore David Belew checked in with his best game on the varsity level and two seniors, Allen Whitmer and Sid Colliatie, iced the game late by making five-of-five from the free throw stripe.

Bell and Belew led the scoring for the Wildcats, hitting 15 points apiece but they had plenty of help from Shook's 12 and 10 from Travis.

A half-court shot by Tim McCool in overtime gave the Lions a last-second, two-point verdict over the Cat jayvees.

Terry Reusser led Mulvane with 12 points but the Cats had plenty of balance as nine players scored. Bo Jones scored seven points and Pat McElravy and Jamie Lough each had six.

Greg Quigley paced the Mulvane sophomores past the Lions, scoring 13 points. Mike Rodgers finished with nine points and Lough had eight.
