## Get 1 Win Under Belts, Wildcats Go For Two

With 10 seconds remaining, senior Greg Hamilton stepped to the free throw line at Collegiate, his thoughts probably drifting back to nine straight defeats. He calmly sank both ends of a one-and-one and Mulvane hit the win column for the first time this basketball season.

Hamilton's heroics provided the cushion the Wildcats needed Saturday afternoon for a 47-45 margin over Collegiate in a non-conference game.

"The most encouraging thing about the game is that we won," beamed Cat coach Charlie Mason. "And considering the game we had to go through a day earlier, we could have lost it. Collegiate had a chance to tie it but we hung on."

Mason pinned the winning effort on the play of Hamilton and another senior, Darryl Brueggeman. "Hamilton was just outstanding, as he has been the last two ball games," said the Cat coach. "He's starting to come around, starting to come around at the right time. Greg has picked up a lot of the scoring load in the last two games--35 points. Brueggeman had a fine game against Collegiate."

With the score tied 46-all, Collegiate had the ball and was holding on for one final shot. After a time out, Hamilton stole an inbounds pass by Collegiate and was fouled. He hit both with 10 seconds left to provide the margin of victory. Greg finished with 19 points and Brueggeman added 10 points. Another senior, Brent Iverson, scored eight.

"And Collegiate isn't a bad ball club either," added Mason. "We just played good baskedball, and without (Kevin)

Burke, a senior, was the club's No. 1 scorer and rebounder before being injured in Friday night's 74-64 defeat at Goddard. Burke may be lost for the season, a decision which was to have been made Wednesday, Jan. 21.

Against the undefeated Goddard Lions, on top of the Division I standings in the Chisholm Trail League, junior Dale Landes scored 11 points, Hamilton had



16 and Brueggeman added 10. Mason termed the Goddard game one of the club's finest this year.

'We really haven't played a bad game since before the Andale game," Mason. "We've been inconsistent at times but we've played 'em tough. We're still getting that one step better every game."

The Wildcat B-team also turned in a victory against Collegiate, rolling up a 51-36 victory. Against Goddard, the Cat B-teamers were clipped, 61-38. Tim Warren led the local scoring with 15 points against Collegiate and Brian Pope added 11. At Goddard, Warren, a
