## MHS Press Pops Augusta

A one-guard offense is sweet music to the ears of Mulvane High School Basketball Coach Charlie Mason, whose Wildcats have been thriving on a menu of bad passes and interceptions and washed down by a flowing quickness.

Many teams with a two-guard offense have had trouble against Mason's outlaws this year and when Augusta rolled out it's one-guard offense Friday night, Jan. 20, in a Chisholm Trail League game, it was like stealing. "They had a tough time with our

pressure defense, that's for sure," admitted Mason after his Wildcats robbed the host Orioles with seven first-quarter turnovers off the press and were off and running in a 65-43 conquest. The victory boosted Mulvane's record

to 8-2, the school's finest start in more than a decade, and gave Mason his first road victory in the CTL Division I this season after dropping road games at Buhler and Valley Center. It also put the Cats back in the chase for the No. 1 spot, tied with Valley Center and two games behind Buhler. The crushing victory also was a

warm-up for the Cats' opener in the 13th annual Roadrunner Classic at Chaparral. The Cats, No. 1 seeded in the tourney, were to have opened the tournament at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 25, against winless Kingman. Mulvane grounded the Orioles in the

first half and used superior quickness on the press to jump ahead, 23-8, after one quarter before putting the game on ice with a 12-8 edge in the second quarter. "We felt like they might be weak at
