give the Cars a victory. Scoring four points in the final six seconds, Mulvane squirted past Wellington, 65-64, to finish 7th for the second straight year.

"We're happy to win after what happened against Ark City," said Mason. "It was pretty depressing but getting an improbable win like this one gives everybody a lift."

The Wildcars opened the tournament against the No. 1 seeded Arkansas City Bulldogs and were whipped, 55-22, in the lowest Mulvane production in more than a decade. Pratt topped the Cats. 69-59. Friday, Jan. 20, in the consolation semi-finals.

Campus put its trademark on the tournament championship late Saturday night, sweeping past Ark City, 69-64. Hession took third place by dumping the host Roadrunners, 53-48, and Pratt was 5th after dropping Clearwater, 45-42.

Mulvane led most of the way against the Crusaders from Wellington but it slipped away in the last four minutes and with 10 seconds. Wellington scored to make it a four-point lead. The Cars threw the ball in but didn't touch it until mid-court, then called time ouf--still with 10 ticks left--as the Wellington defense went to sleep.

On the in-bounds play, Mulvane's Larry Lambrecht, who scored a career high of 6 points, came off a screen and hit a three-pointer, then called another time out with five seconds left. The trouble was nobody except the official scorer believed Mulvane had a time out left, so no technical was called.

Mulvane played tough defense on the in-bounds play and Jeff Sisco deflected a pass to the opposite side of the court. On the next throw-in by Wellington, the ball hit the back of the backboard and Mulvane took over on the turnover, still with five seconds left. On the throw-in, Sisco broke free under the bucket and scored as the horn sounded.

"I guess that's the miracle of the three-pointer," said Mason. "We got a tremendous break when Larry scored three and then there was the question about the time outs. On the in-bounds play, we played good defense to keep them from getting the ball in, then to have Sisco win the game."

The victory avenged two earlier defeats to Wellington. "We wanted to come out strong, we can't line up and play with anybody," said Mason. "We got the good lead but then in the second half, we played like we were just trying to hang on, hoping for time to go by but it, didn't."

Sisco had his best game of the season, finishing with 16 points to give Lambrecht's outside game big help inside. Senior Sean Gillespie scored four points.

"We had a number of kids play well," praised Mason. "John Heinrichs had a good first quarter. Todd Hedstrom made a big bucket late in the game. Sisco had a great game and the big basket, and you can't over-estimate Larry's 36 points."

Mason said the winning bucket came off a set play and Sisco was the first option. "We ran a box and Jeff was lucky enough to shake free under the basket." said Mason, who designed the play in a time out called by Wellington. "We figured they would be looking for us to go to Larry so we decided to go with the box and we ran it to perfection. Jeff did the rest by dropping it in to win

it. I guess we did some things well."

They didn't in the opener against the strong Bulldogs from Ark City. The Cats made only eight field goals and were

made only eight field goals and were never in the game after Ark City plunged out to a 12-4 first quarter advantage.

"Ark City's big 6-9 kid blocked five shots in the first half and we were just too intimidated to do anything after that," confessed the veteran Mason.

Lambrecht scored nine points to pace Mulvane in that game, too. Gillespie and Curtis Norden were next-high with four points apiece.

Mulvane fell behind early against Prait, too, the Greenbacks rolling out to an 18-8 lead after one quarter. Even a second half comeback couldn't get the Cats on top. "We played pretty good in the second half (when MHS out-scored Prait, 42-29). Defensively, it was about our best half of the year."


