

Wildcats Take Sixth In Halstead Invitational

The Mulvane High School Wildcats took sixth place in the Adolph Rupp Invitational Tournament held in Halstead last week. The 'Cats didn't come away empty handed - they were awarded the Sportsmanship Trophy.

Mulvane lost in the opening round to Halstead and then topped Ellsworth in the first round of the consolation bracket. They lost Friday's consolation finals to Goddard, 88-54.

It was a case of the Lions' torrid shooting that derailed Mulvane. Goddard canned 32 of 54 for 59 percent. Mulvane hit 36 percent of their field goal tries. Goddard held a 48-22 half-time lead.

Terry Craig paced Mulvane's scoring with 18 points. Troy Richardson chipped in 13 and snared nine rebounds. Win Over Ellsworth

Mulvane broke its losing streak with a 68-61 victory over Ellsworth in the first round of the consolation bracket played last Thursday at Halstead.

Junior Randy Martinez came off the bench to net 10 points to help keep the Wildcats in the game. Senior Terry Craig turned in his usual top scoring performance with 21 tallies.

For one of the few times this year, Mulvane received balanced scoring. Junior guard Skip Day, who has been a steady performer, added 15 tallies. Dan Carmichael continued his scoring with another 14-point performance.

Mulvane survived a cold shoot-

ing first half—hitting only 32 percent. Overall, Mulvane was 26 of 62 for 39 percent. The 'Cats hit 46 percent in the second half.

Troy Richardson and Dan Carmichael topped Mulvane's rebounding with six each. Craig added five.
