The Cats had been picked to play early and go home ended up in the championship game before defending tourney kingpin Pratt ended Mulvane's Cinderella Story with a 64-38 verdict. Still, Mulvane won a large second place trophy.

"Nobody expected us to get that far but we did," said Wildcat cage coach Charlie Mason. 'The Pratt paper did a rundown on all the teams and picked us 6th. About the only thing we couldn't be happy about is that we didn't play better in the second half against a very strong Pratt team."

Mulvane's trail to the top was littered with pretenders. The Cats opened the week-long tournament by nipping Arkansas City, 48-47, in overtime and followed that up Friday night, Jan. 22, with a stunning upset over previously unbeaten Chaparral, 52-42.

Against the Greenbacks, Mulvane was right there knocking at the door again strough the first quarter. Senior Tim Warren, who had a spectacular tournament, scored nine points in the quarter. Pratt shut down Warren in the second quarter and the MHS game collapsed.

Mulvane's offense could muster only 10 points and that was the ball game.

Warren finished with 19 points. Senior Dale Landes scores six, as did junior center David Hagerman.

The 6-foot-1 Warren went crazy against the host Roadrunners a night earlier. He had 25 points. Vic Marcelle scored 11 points and sophomore guard Revin Bell added seven. Chaparral's two top players missed the game because of disciplinary action.
