Wildcats Earn Tourney Plaudits

On the surface, 7th place in an eight-team tournament isn't anything to shout about but Mulvane High School boys basketball coach is doing plenty of shouting following the 17th annual Chaparral Roadrunner Boys Classic Saturday, Jan. 23.

The Wildcats ended the tournament by sideswiping Ulysses, 86-63, for 7th place. Mulvane opened the tournament seeded 8th and gave previously undefeated and No. 1 seeded Arkansas City all it wanted before a 73-64 meltdown Wednesday night, Jan. 20. In the semifinal match-up, the Wildcats took on old rival Pratt and tumbled, 66-63, Friday afternoon, Jan. 22.

Kingman of the Chisholm Trail League captured the championship by clipping Ark City, 67-60, and Chaparral downed Clearwater easily, 53-41, to take third place. Pratt burned Wellington, 77-67, for the consolation title.

"We played a good tournament," stressed the Cats' Mason. "Recordwise, it doesn't look like we did, but we played the No. 1 team in the state in 5A, then played Pratt with their great size and pushed both of them right down to the wire. I feel a lot better coming out of the tournament this year than I did last year at this time.

"Last year, that was our flat period. We didn't play well in any of the three games. I think we played some good basketball, though, this year. The two losses came against people who had better personnel and we pushed both down to the wire. Ark City has three kids who can shoot three-pointers and the 6-8 kid inside. Pratt has a 6-6 in the middle."

Lost in the shuffle is the Ulysses onslaught. The Wildcats came out smoking and it was little contest after tacking up a 23-10 lead after one quarter. By intermission, Mulvane was looking good with a 42-24 advantage.

"I wasn't worried about a letdown against Ulysses," said Mason about playing for last place. "We've already been in that position once this year and we were wanting the win after two close ones. The kids, I believe, realize now that they can play with anybody. We pushed Ark City to the limit and Pratt to the limit. If we go out and do things to the best of our ability, we're going to be allright.

The Wildcats, now 5-8 heading into the heart of the CTL season, were just too tough for the slower Tigers from Ulysses. Ten of the 11-man squad scored with senior center Toby Butcher having a field day with 23 points. Senior Shay Cornejo dumped in 16 points and Larry Lambrecht and Neal Hamilton gave the Cats four in twin figures with 13 and 12, respectively. John Melick added nine points.

In the opener against the Bulldogs, Mulvane fell behind early, then came on. Ark City came out to take a 19-15 lead but by halftime, Mulvane had that tied up at 31s.

Cornejo's 21 points, 20 by Butcher, 11 by Lambrecht and nine by Hamilton carried the Wildcats against Ark City.

Mulvane rallied against Pratt in the second half to get back in the ball game after the Greenbacks had taken a 20-12 lead after one quarter. Cornejo again led the way with 29 points. Lambrecht scored 13 points and Butcher had 12.

The Cats forced a 62-61 lead in the final moments against Pratt but the Greenbacks went inside for two to recapture the lead. Pratt missed two free throws late but the Wildcats couldn't take advantage of the miscues and a three-point shot by Cornejo at the gun was off the mark.

"We came within about five minutes of being in the championship game," said Mason, whose club finished 4th a year ago on the way to a third place finish in the 4A state tournament. "We played extremely hard and extremely well. I think Cornejo, Butcher and Hamilton had outstanding tournaments. Like I said earlier, we are continuing to improve, and I feel a lot better after this year's tournament than I did after last year's."

The Wildcat boys will be idle Friday night but swing back into the thick of the CTL chase Tuesday, Feb. 2, at Valley Center before three consecutive home games.

MHS Senior Cornejo Named All-Tourney

Mulvane High School senior Shay Cornejo was the lone Wildcat to be named to the all-tournament team following the conclusion Saturday night, Jan. 23, of the 17th annual Chaparral Roadrunner Classic.

Cornejo, the tournament's No. 2 scorer with a 22-point average, made the all-tourney team on the basis of an overall fine tournament, leading Mulvane to 7th place. The 6-foot, 2-inch senior scored 66 points for Mulvane. Mulvane's second "top gun," Toby Buthcer had 55 points and was not selected.

Joining Cornejo on the elite unit were Mike Minton and Chris Howell who guided Kingman to the tournament championship; guard Kent Murphree, Shane Mullen and 6-foot, 8-inch Darin Stewart of Arkansas City; Jade Beam of Chaparral; Matt McIntire of Wellington; Brennen Wood of Pratt; and Chris Hickman of Clearwater, who was the tournament's top scorer with 70 points.

The 6-8 Hickman, Beam, Wood and Minton were named to the team for the second straight year and Howell was all-tourney for the second time, too, having been named to the unit in 1986 as a sophomore.

Minton, Stewart and McIntire are the only juniors on the first team, the rest being seniors.
