The loss saw Mulvane slipping to 6-7 overall and 1-4 in the league, and Buhler improved to 4-8 and 2-4.

"Every time we go out on the floor, we have to prove something," said MHS Coach Ryan Herrs. "We have to be ready for the other team's challenges. I told the kids before the season that there wasn't one team that was going to give them a win, that they had to work hard to take every win. Buhler came out with a lot of confidence. They were on fire against us."

The Crusaders dumped in their first eight field attempts and were off and running as the Cats tried to regroup. "We just weren't guarding their shooters," emphasized Herrs. "They came out on fire. They hit the first nine shots against and and you just don't recover from that. Our confidence was shaken and it was just too much for us to overcome."

The Crusaders hit a couple of layups first, then dropped through seven more in a row to take the early lead. Buhler outscored the Cats, 30-16, in the second and third quarters and never quite regained their confidence. "The staff had been billing this game as one we could win, but when they came out on fire, that was a real blow. It showed in the second quarter when we scored only four points.
