Maize Boys Turn Up The Heat; MHS Cats Continue to Scrap

A pattern of unforced errors led the Mulvane High School boys down a familiar path Tuesday night, Jan. 30, when Maize came to town for a Chisholm Trail League basketball game.

The Eagles handed the Cats a steady dose of pressure and steadily pulled away for a 73-45 triumph. The loss dropped Mulvane's record to 1-12 for the season and 0-6 in the CTL after the first round of loop contests. Maize maintained its share of the CTL Division I lead with a 5-1 mark.

The Wildcats did break out of their "third quarter doldrums." Coach Ryan Herrs' team "won" the 3rd quarter, 15-6, but the Eagles had already built up a 36-15 edge at the mid-point.

The MHS boys are shooting it less and enjoying it less. That's kind of an over-simplification of the basketball season so far for Coach Ryan Herrs and the Wildcat boys.

Mulvane started sluggishly Friday night, Jan. 26, when Buhler came to town and the Crusaders slapped the Cats quickly in a 77-32 thrashing. The CTL game gave Buhler an outstanding 11-2 mark and 5-1 in the CTL. The Cats suffered their 11th defeat in 12 outings so far this year.

"Buhler is a really good team," said Herrs. "Of the teams we've seen this year, they are one of the top two (Goddard is the other one). They're real solid and very, very aggressive. And they score well which made it hard for us to defend them, but the statistic that jumped out at me while I was going over the film is that we hit one of our first two shots but by the time we had taken two shots, they already had taken 10."

The Crusaders used that advantage to scramble out to a 22-5 edge after the first quarter of the game. After that, it wasn't pretty to watch for Cat fans. By intermission, Buhler had a 40-18 lead.

"They did some pressuring and that gave us a lot of problems again," emphasized Herrs. "I think we must have had 32 turnovers. We had a lot of "em. We're still trying to work on some bad habits. We're still trying to get guys to spots for pressure relief and trying to get others to get the confidence to dribble the ball around people rather than just stand there with the ball over their heads."

Another factor was that the Crusaders shut down the MHS inside game for the most part. Mulvane's top inside scorer, Ryan McKnight, didn't get a bucket. "Their big guys were very strong and inside

going to just walk on the floor and win games. We have to go out and take them away from people."

Herrs also felt a spark of leadership showed on the floor. "Jason Wilson tried to step up and be a leader for us and he did give us some effort, and so did Chris Gerhardt," admitted Herrs. "And Brian Love had a very solid game. He's not going to go out there and score a lot of points for us but he did go out there and play his tail off. He had a good ball game for us."

The Wildcat offense still sputtered, though, as the team posted its 7th game at 40 points or under. "We got some good looks but it goes back to knocking them down," said Herrs. "We just have a hard time hitting the shots when they are there."

Wilson was in double figures again, scoring a team-high 12 points. Gerhardt chipped in with seven points and Andy Hixson, Love and Luke Gunter scored four points apiece.

In the junior varsity game Friday night, the Crusaders held off the Cats in the last quarter to claim a 60-47 verdict.

Kale Regier had a career-best 18 points and Dusty Sorensen scored 11. Tyler Hennes finished with nine points for Mulvane.
