The Orioles backed up all the accolades with a dominating performance in the first half. They led Mulvane 36-15 at the break.

"We talked at halftime about playing for pride because we had nothing to lose," Landes said.

The 'Cats played well in the second half, scoring 40 points.

"We got beyond the awe and pushed the ball better," Landes said. "We spread it around and shot well."

The result was balanced scoring with everyone getting into the act. Jeremy Brown had 10 points. Jeff Parker scored nine, Matt Hendren totalled eight and both Abasolo and Carpenter added seven points. It was a season high for Hendren.

"Matt has been progressing all season, working himself into more playing time at the varsity level," Landes said.

Competing for even a half against a team like Augusta was a positive for Landes.

"We are the kind of team where we just have to concentrate on what we are doing," he said.

The jayvee squad concentrated their way to a 63-47 win over Augusta. After falling behind by nine points early, the Wildcats dominated the Orioles from that point.

"I was real frustrated after the first quarter," JV Coach Scott Swaney said. "We ran away with it in the fourth quarter."

Neil Gosch led all scorers with 16 points.
"He had a real nice game," Swaney said.

Brad Canfield netted 10 points for Mulvane.
