Mulvane Boys 'Box Up' Goddard Scorer

A box-and-one defense is something Mulvane High School basketball coach Charlie Mason hasn't resorted to in quite a few years, but Friday night, Jan. 30, it came in pretty handy.

"Fact of the matter is I've never used it since I've been in Mulvane," confessed Mason, who is quietly heading for his 100th career victory in eight years in Mulvane. "It took us a little while to get going offensively and we made the adjustment to a box-and-one defensively to stop (Jared) Mares. Kyle Steadman did a great job on Mares and we started pulling away."

The Wildcats hammered the Lions in the final three quarters after the host Lions kept pace early. When the final gun sounded, Mulvane walked away with a 75-58 decision, running the Cat record to 3-0 in the Chisholm Trail League and 8-3 overall.

After struggling early, Mulvane broke away from a 20-18 game in the second quarter as Steadman shut down Mares, who had 14 points in the first half and only three in the second. "We just tried to bottle him up as best we could," said Mason of Mares. "We just didn't want him to score 30. It seemed like the thing to do at the time and it did take him out of their offense."

Steadman had an outstanding game. Not only did he put the defensive clamps on Mares, he finished with a game-high 19 points and a team-high nine rebounds. His backcourt mate, Curtis Hicks, also was in double figures with 18 points. Senior forward Morgan LeClair scored 17 points and Todd Fox finished with 11.

"Our guards (Steadman and Hicks) had an outstanding night shooting the ball," said the MHS chief. "Steadman's having a heck of a year. It was his best game."

They also got the Mulvane fastbreak

galloping in the final three quarters. "We tried to run the options off our offense but a lot of times we never got past the fastbreak," said Mason. "We've been trying to move the ball up the floor more quickly and it was pretty successful against Goddard."

Mason said Mulvane's biggest concern now is to gain consistency. "I think once we get going in February on our Tuesday-Friday routine, I think we'll get more consistency," said Mason. "We're still a little rough on some things."

The MHS junior varsity notched another victory, whipping Goddard by
