## Hot Hornets Swarm Cat Boys, Knock MHS From Contender Role

Blame it on the Valley Center water, or blame it on quicker, bigger people. Any way you cut it, the Hornets sliced up the Mulvane Wildcat boys Tuesday night, Feb. 4, in a Chisholm Trail League

VC handed the Cats their worst drubbing of the season, an 82-60 dose of Valley Center hospitality, establishing the Hornets as a force in the CTL title chase and relegating Coach Charlie Mason's Wildcats to the role of on-lookers. VC is 4-1 in the league and Mulvane is 2-3.

It was a clean sweep for the host school, too, as the Hornet junior varsity boys toppled Mulvane, 70-60, in the jayvee game and 52-50 in the sophomore game.

"Valley Center has more quickness and more size than Goddard," said Mason. "That, by far, is the best Valley Center team we've faced in years, even better than the one we faced in sub-state play several years ago. They have good quickness and good size and know how to use it."

Mason said shooting also played a part, as the Hornets hit nearly 65% of their field attempts. "You're going to shoot a good percentage if you get close-in shots," said Mason. "They used their size inside and got a lot of offensive rebounds and put them back in. They played well and we compounded our problem by not playing very good."

Juniors Morgan LeClair and Todd Fox were the only Cats in twin figures. LeClair scored 16 points and Fox had 14. Andrew Swayne finished with eight and Curtis Hicks scored six.

For the Wildcat jayvees, Cornejo's 17 points led the way with Lyle Graybeal scoring 14 points and Jeff Williams getting 12.

VC won the battle of sophomores--but just barely. Toby Butcher scored a career-high 22 points to power Mulvane's sophs. Russell Norden and Neal Hamilton also were in double figures for the Cats, scoring 11 points apiece.
