

Mulvane Wildcats Rout Derby, 52-34

The Mulvane high school Wildcats roared high, wide and handsome over their neighbors to the north Tuesday night in the local gym when they clipped the Derby Panthers to the tune of 52-34.

Coach Jim Parker had plenty of praise for his charges following the tilt. "Our boys played their best defensive game of the year and they have gained confidence in themselves," the mentor commented. Mulvane set up a stone wall and held. Now they are ready to take on Clearwater here Friday night.
