In the best "spectator game" of the season, the Wildcats willed up the courage to come back from squandering a big lead early in the game and rallied from five points off the pace to spring past the Trojans, 71-67, in a nonconference game.

"It was a game of contrasts," said Cat coach Charlie Mason. "We had a pretty good first half and in the second half, they got the momentum going and hit the shots to get back in the game. I was real proud of the way we came back. Greg (Quigley) and Aaron (Huslig) had super games. Greg was outstanding, though. He got those two buckets to get us back in the game and then the free throws. He saved us."

Quigley had 20 points, second-high to 6-foot-3 senior Lonny Travis, who scored 23 points. Both Huslig and David Belew scored 13 points for Mulvane.

The Wildcats, running their record to 13-2, sprinted out to a 28-14 lead in the initial quarter, then watched it melt to 46-39 in the third quarter, then watched it melt even further as Andover reeled off a 10-1 spurt at the start of the fourth quarter to take a 62-57 lead with 4:21 left in the game.

The Trojans, who are 9-6, were rolling. Mulvane's top gun, Travis, saddled with his 4th foul with 2:53 left in the third quarter, came out cold. Belew missed two free throws, then Huslig

The 6-3 senior Travis, a definite all-state candidate who is averaging more than 24 points an outing, popped in 33 points and had 12 rebounds, and the big pivot, 6-5 Aaron Huslig, scored 19 points, with nine rebounds. Fancy guard Belew added 16 points and senior Buddy Moyer scored eight.

The varsity led a 5-0 sweep in all games against the Orioles as both the boys junior varsity and sophomores won as did the MHS girls and girls jayvees. The boys layvees took two overtimes before disposing of Augusta, 78-70, to notch their first victory of the year, and the Cat sophs issued a 57-49 beating, running their record to 4-1.

For the Mulvane jayvees, Morgan LeClair gunned in a career-high 27 points, guard Curtis Hicks added 17 and junior Mike Stump and Andrew Swayne scored 10 apiece. In overtime, the Cats spurted behind Hicks' four points, 2-for-2 free throwing by Wes Moore and LeClair's three points.

The sophomore boys jumped to a 33-16 halftime lead and held on the rest of the contest. Todd Fox and Kyle Steadman both scored 12 points to pace Mulvane. Jeff Williams and Swayne finished with six points each.
