Effort Collapses As Roadrunners Run Wildcats

The on-egain, off-again Mulvane defense was off-again Tuesday night, Feb. 6, and it didn't take Chaparral long to exploit the Wildcats.

The Roadrunners were just that-running out to an early lead to humble Mulvane, 84-67, in a Chisholm Trail League boys basketball game in Mulvane.

The loss skidded the Wildcats' record to 4-8 overall and 2-6 in the Chisholm Trail League. Chaparral, coached by Sam Beam, evened its record at 7-7 overall and 3-5 in CTL games.

The Mulvane B-Team played better but still tumbled, 61-55, in the preliminary game.

Two weeks ago, it appeared the Wildcats were poised to make a late-season charge, similar to the one of last season, after a good Bluestem Classic. Mulvane was 5-10 a year ago but finished with a rush and a good showing in the Augusta Sub-State. After the last couple of games, Wildcat coach Rod Pock isn't so sure.

"We just didn't play any basketball against Chaparral," said the perplexed Pock. "No offense. No defense. You name it." And it was much the same story a week earlier in a 20-point loss to Buhler.

The Roadrunners whipped Mulvane as soundly as anybody this season. Hitting seven of 15 from the field, Beam's boys jumped out to a 17-12 advantage in the first quarter, then blew the game wide open in the second quarter by outscoring Mulvane, 28-8. During that stretch, the Roadrunners hit eight of 13 fielders while Mulvane made only three of 12.

The rest of the game was catch-up and the Wildcats have a difficult time playing that game.

"I thought they were ready to play," said Pock. "We shot almost as many times as they did but when they shoot 43 times at the free throw line and make 65 percent of them, you're going to get beat."

Thirty-one fouls by Mulvane did the trick. Both teams made 28 field goals but Chaparral sent Mulvane to the line for only 21 shots and the Cats made only 11 while the Roadrunners hit 28 of 43.

"They've got a pretty good ball club despite their record," pointed out Pock. They've played everybody close-Goddard, Kingman, Medicine Lodge. They are better than their record shows. And Sam Beam is probably one of the better coaches in the league."

The Roadrunners are hot, too. That helps. The triumph over the Wildcats was the sixth in the last seven games.

"We never got into our offense and we didn't play our defense," cited Pock. "They pushed us outside and we didn't go to the middle. They pressured everybody. We were in the nickle bleachers by the time the second quarter was over."

Junior Mark Smith led three Mulvane players in double-figure scoring. The 6 foot-2 Smith scored 16 points. Courtney Gammon and guard Troy Wayman, a pair of seniors, also hit double figures, scoring 14 and 12 points respectively. However, game scoring honors went to Chaparral's Richie Giesen, who scored 19 points.

furnovers helped keep the Wildeat offense from generating a serious run. The Cats had 20 turnovers to Chaparral's pressure defense and the roadrun ners had only six turnovers.

Mulvane won the rebound battle, 36-33, as Smith pulled down nine caroms and junior Mark Storey had seven.

Next game for the Wildcats is Friday. Feb. 9, at home against Chisholm Trail leading Goddard.
