

# Goddard Shells Cats

Usually coaches complain about fouls that aren't called but Mulvane High School basketball coach Roger Pock pulled a switch. He's complaining about fouls that were called.

The Mulvane Wildcats and Goddard played Tuesday night in a marathon high school basketball game at Goddard, one that lasted more than two hours. The host Lions stopped Mulvane, 70-53, in a Chisholm Trail League game.

They certainly called them tight," said Pock. "We had four guys foul out and I think the calling stalled both teams. Nobody could move."

The loss dropped Mulvane's record to 5-10 for the season and 2-7 overall. Goddard improved its stock in the conference to 7-2 and coach Rick Henson's Lions are 9-5 overall, beating Mulvane three straight times this season.

One bright spot, according to Pock, was the play of reserve Steve Steinbach, who came off the bench to score nine points.

Dale Walker, a 6-foot senior and the Cats' leading scorer this season, topped the scorers Tuesday night with 13 points. Guard Jeff Arroyo added 11 points with Steinbach finishing third high.
