Wildcat Boys Pressing More, Opponents Enjoying It Less

Mulvane High School boys basketball coach, Charlie Mason, has a secret, but with each victory, it's becoming less and less of a secret.

And the Wildcats have 13 victories this season.

The secret weapon is a swarming pressure defense, the same one which enabled the Wildcats to blast off like Challenger Tuesday night, Feb. 7, at Andover. The Cats launched a 70-44 non-league victory over the Trojans with an 18-2 spurt to start the game.

The victory boosted the Mulvane record to 13-2 heading into a critical Chisholm Trail League shootout with Buhler Friday night, Feb. 10. The Cats need a victory to remain in the CTL chase.

"We're going to come out pressing," said Mason after the Andover win, "because that's out best game. We got off to a good start pressuring from the opening tip and I don't think we have ever gotten out of the gate like that."

Andover, which sank to 8-8, made a run at the Cats in the fourth quarter, got to within 11 before a half-court trap ignited the final Mulvane run.

"I'm really pleased with the defense we've been playing," admitted Mason. "In our last six games, we've given up only 44 points a game. We really shut them down inside, except for (Brent) Wasson."

The Cats also dominated the backboards, giving up only three offensive rebounds to Andover. Overall, MHS gained a 36-27 edge.

Four players hit twin figures with junior Lonny Travis leading the balanced assault with 16 points and seniors Kevin Bell and Todd Travis and junior David Belew adding 14 points apiece.

In the junior varsity game at Andover, Mulvane rallied from a poor second quarter, out-scoring the Trojans, 37-21, in the last half for a 53-49 decision. The Cat jayvee record is 7-2. Buddy Moyer scored 14 points for the Cats and Greg Quigley and Aaron Huslig added 10 points apiece.

The Mulvane sophomore boys couldn't make it a sweep despite 12-point nights

from Rick Lanzrath and Wes Moore. Andover won, 57-48.
