Hornets Muscle Out Cats, Marcelle's Shot Chills Hosts

Valley Center muscled up against Mulvane in a postponed boys basketball game Tuesday night, Feb. 9, and paralyed that muscle and some fourth quarter free throwing into a 66-52 verdict over the Cats in a game at Mulvane.

The loss, the third in the last four games for Mulvane, lowered the Cat, record to 6-8 overall and 2-5 in the Chisholm Trail League. Valley is 7-7 and 3-4.

"Valey Center is physical and anytime they can use that in a game (in a loose game), they're tough to beat," said Cat coach Charlie Mason.

Seniors Tim Warren and Vic Marcelle led the Cats with 20 and 18 points, respectively. Center David Hagerman has eight points.

Mulvane took an early lead in the junior varsity game and held on for a 48-38 decision. High for the MHS jayvees was sophomore J.C. Shook, who scored 12 points, and guard Sid Colliatie, who had 10.

In a sophomore game, Valley rolled to an easy 45-29 victory after taking 23-12 lead at intermission. Terry Reusser led Mulvane's scorers with 12 points and Pat McElravy scored six.

Wellington is fast becoming a favorite for the Wildcats. The MHS boys registered their second victory of the year against the Crusaders, nipping the hosts, 47-45, in a Chisholm Trail League game Friday, Feb. 5.

A shot from 22 feet by Vic Marcelle nestled into the nets to give the cats a two-point lead with two seconds left on the clock. Sophomore guard Kevin Bell made a bucket with 1:30 left to give Mulvane a 45-43 lead before Wellington's Bruce Washington made a pair of

free throws to tie things heading into the final 55 seconds.

"It was our best game all year defensively," emphasized Mason. "We went man-to-man most of the time and Marcelle on (Linn) Hibbs and (David) Hagerman on Washington was the key. They both did a tremendous job because those two Wellington boys didn't get a shot without a hand in their face all night. And (Dale) Landes did a fine job on that Sneed kid."

In addition, it was Mulvane's best shooting night of the year, although the pace of the game kept the score down. The Wildcats hit 48% of their field
