

Wildcats Push Goddard To Hilt, 3rd Quarter Seals Doom

Showing signs of better times ahead, the Mulvane boys basketball squad did battle with Goddard Thursday night, Feb. 5, and although the Lions prevailed behind a third quarter surge, they did not get away unbruised--in more ways than one.

The Wildcats played Goddard even-up except they couldn't stop Goddard's Marty Frankamp, who poured in 34 points. The loss sent coach Charlie Mason's Wildcats skidding to 3-11 and 0-6 in Chisholm Trail League play heading into Friday night's encounter at Valley Center.

And while the Cats couldn't work magic on the scoreboard, they certainly roughed up the visiting Lions as 37 fouls attests. "That's got to be close (to a school record) if it isn't in fact one," said Mason. "All we can ask for is consistency in the officiating and I don't think they were."

Overall, however, Mason was as pleased as he could be with any loss. "I think we played up to our potential for the first time this season," cited the Mulvane coach. "I'm talking about as a team. We used 12 people--with all the fouls we had, we had to use that many--and no matter who was in there, it didn't hurt us.

"(Kevin) Burke is one example," added Mason. "He gave us a lot more than we figured he would on his first time back (from injury). He got 12 rebounds, which is his average. Greg (Hamilton) and Brent (Iverson) did a good job offensively and you can say the same about the job Mark Fox and Marc Huslig did, too."

What pleased Mason the most, though, was the club's ability to adjust, something that hasn't been happening in previous games. "We made adjust-

ments from time to time and the kids responded to those adjustments," said Mason. "It was just a super overall team effort but the foul line took it away from us. Any time you shoot 50 percent from the field, you ought to win."

The Wildcats made half their field shots (27-57) but Goddard made 32 of 48 at the stripe to keep Mulvane from becoming a fourth straight defeat.

The Cats posted their best balanced scoring game of the season, too, as nine players reached the scoring column. Seniors Hamilton and Iverson were the only double-figure scorers, hitting 12

and 10 points, respectively, but they had loads of help from Darryl Brueggeman (9 points), Fox (8), Dale Landes (8) and Tim Warren (6).

The Mulvane junior varsity got blown away by Goddard in a 75-52 defeat. Danny Harvey and Tim Warren led the junior varsity Cats with 13 and 12 points, respectively, and Mike Coffey had seven.

In a sophomore game, Goddard raced to a 65-38 triumph. For the Mulvane sophs, Wayne Rich and Chris Hicks each scored eight points and Todd Robinson had six.
