Mulvane Shakes Off Ragged Start,

Bench Play Paces Andover Victory

Mulvane High School broke its pattern of ragged play in the second half, Andover didn't. Coach Charlie Mason's Wildcars used the difference as a springboard Tuesday night, Feb. 11, to a 63-47 decision over lowly Andover in a non-conference clash.

The victory boosted MHS's record to 7-8 overall and the visiting Trojans plummetted to 2-14.

"For much of the game, we played like we were 2-14, too," admitted Mason, Mulvane's winningest cage coach. "We were really fortunate to win considering as how we played. Going into a game like that, you're always concerned about consistency. We've been off-and-on anyway, but the kids came off the bench to play well. Reese (Brown, subbing for suspended Andrew Swayne) played well and Bryson (Butts) did a good job. Jeff (Williams) and Shay (Cornejo) came in there late and knocked down the free throws just when we needed them, and Kevin (Kastl) made a couple of baskets when we needed them."

The Cats, who are in the thick of the race for one of the four home games in the first round of the sub-state, struggled early as a 16-16 first quarter score would indicate. But by the third quarter, Mulvane had the game under control by more than a 10-point margin.

Junior Morgan LeClair finished with a game-high 22 points and another junior, Todd Fox, scored 10. Curtis Hicks was next with eight and Kyle Steadman finished with six as 11 Cats hit the scoring column.

The Wildcat junior varsity also pounded Andover, 74-60, as Cornejo pumped in 19 points and Williams and Lyle Graybeal had 14 and Nick Fortin added 10 for Coach Dennis Tegethoff's 5-4 club.

The Cats racked up one of their best triumphs of the year Friday night, Feb. 7, at Augusta in a Chisholm Trail League outing. With junior Curtis Hicks throwing in a 18-foot baseline jumper with one second to tick, the Wildcats proved it wasn't how but how many. They nosed out the host Orioles, 59-58.

The victory improved Mulvane's CTL record to 3-3 and Augusta tumbled to 2.4 in the league.

"It was one of our most gratifying victories from the standpoint that we had our backs to the wall the whole ball game and only led twice." said Mason.

The Cats did, indeed, lead only twice, once at 57-56 and again at 59-58, but that last one counted. Augusta appeared to be in the driver's seat with 10 seconds taking a 58-57 lead. Todd Fox had given the Cats their first lead in the game with 25 seconds to play when he hit a baseline jumper from 12 feet. A timeout gave Mason an opportunity near midcourt to set a play, which culminated with Hicks' winning shot.

"We wanted to run our standard out-of-bounds play but instead of Fox taking the shot behind a two-man screen, we figured they would be looking for that so we set it up the same but went to the weak side to Curtis,"

It was the same play we used right before half and Curtis just knocked it down. Sometimes it works just like you drew it up, sometimes it doesn't."

Until the last 25 seconds, Augusta's inside tandem of Curtis Patten and Craig Sharp had hurt Mulvane, scoring 42 points between them. Down the stretch, though, it was a quick Wildcat press which kept the Orioles off-balance and upset and that's how the Cats got back in the game.

"That's the first time all year that we've been able to press the way we can press," said Mason. "We gave them a couple of lay-ups but really played good defense, especially in the second half. They had real trouble even getting the ball in bounds.

Fox led Mulvane's scorers with 18 points and junior frontline mate! LeClair punched in another 17 points. Hicks finished with 13 points and guard Kyle Steadman scored six.

Augusta won the other two boys games of the evening. The MHS junior varsity couldn't get rolling in the second half and the Orioles clipped the Cats, 62-51. And in the sophomore game, Augusta pulled away at the end for a 47-38 decision.

Guards Shay Cornejo and Jeff Williams carried the Cat jayvee offense. hitting for 15 and 13 points, respectively. Lyle Graybeal and Nick Fortin scored eight points each.

Mulvane's sophs were powered by a 10-point effort by Ken Baer. Jeremy Hoenscheidt was next with eight points and Rodger Kendall scored six points.

The next action for the Wildcats will be at home Friday, Feb. 15, in a big Chisholm Trail battle with leagueleading Buhler.
