

GODDARD TAMES WILDCATS

The Goddard Lions, last Tuesday night, shot the eyes out of the baskets by hitting 7 out of their first 8 shots and at one time scored 10 straight points. Mulvane was paced by Senior Forward Robbie Fry who scored 19 points, (14 points came in the first half), in the game. The story of the night was the question of when would the Lions cool off. The B-team won on a shot by Chad Scott with 7 seconds left. The B-team record now stands at 5 and 7.
