With the postponement of the Clearwater game due to the weather, Mulvane will have to cram their final three game in before starting sub-state play.

"We have three games left and we need to improve if we have any plans of doing anything at sub-state," Landes said.

Circle is ranked in state, but the other two games, Chaparral and Clearwater appear to possibly be in reach of Mulvane.

Mulvane beat Clearwater 46-41 earlier in the season.

"We need to play well, but they are struggling like us." Landes said of Clearwater. "We don't want to lose because we are competing for seeds in sub-state."

In the junior varsity game, Mulvane fell to the Indians by a score of 58-38.

The sophomore boys got nipped by Andale 48-47 in what was a close battle all the way. Sam Roebuck led the Wildcats with 15 points, while Greg Nunn scored 11. Zach Wayman and Michael Johnson each added nine points.

The boys will next hit the hardwood tonight (Feb. 16) at Chaparral, Game time is 8 p.m.
